Despite China's recent troubles, prospects for its entrepreneurial private sector remain bright

"We've seen tremendous financial market volatility, stock market ruction that of course, captured the world's attention, a small devaluation that was handled badly by the government and that led to a crisis of confidence. So at the moment, there's a prevailing mood of pessimism about China and its economy, and I think this is overdone."

"You have to remember that there are two Chinas; the state sector, which tends to be poorly run, but we have an incredibly vibrant private sector and it has really come into its own over the last decade. China's private sector firms [have] outperformed the state sector. So that's why I say there are really two Chinas, and one of those is heading towards some trouble, but the more dynamic, entrepreneurial, more innovative China is the private sector and it's going from strength to strength."

"Innovation is going to be at the heart of what drives the Chinese economy forward. That innovation will come almost entirely from the private sector; both multinationals as well as Chinese companies Interdependence' is really the story of the rise of China."


